

An Anchor on the Dashboard for Gadgets That Travel

Finding a dashboard holder for your cell phone, palmtop computer or pocket navigational system can be complicated if your device or your car is not among the most popular models.

One solution is a modular system from ProClip: a bracket mounted inside the car fits a holder designed for a phone or other device.

There are brackets to fit just about every car sold in America, from a Geo to a Rolls Royce, and holders for almost 50 brands of portable devices.

For some cars, module choices let you mount more than one device. The brackets cost \$29.95 each, cell phone holders are \$19.95, and holders for hand-held devices are \$24.95 to \$84.95 (the more expensive models include charger connections). You can place an order at the company's Web site, www.proclipusa.com.

ProClip says that installation takes no more than 30 seconds to 2 minutes. Mounting a Sanyo phone in a 1996 Saab took about a minute and a half.
